Kislingbury Parish Council May 2023

These notes reflect the last two meetings of the Parish Council which included the Annual Parish Meeting on 18th April and the Annual Parish Council Meeting on 16th May 2023. At both these meetings a number of parishioners were present and made valuable contributions. I think that this is a very encouraging development which means the Parish Council will be able to achieve more on behalf of the village.

In these notes, I go on to make some suggestions about how you might become involved. These are:

- **To make immediate comments on the Hodges Lane planning application**
- **To be ready to make comments on the 'new' Beech Lane development**
- **Add your garden trees to the village tree map**
- **To contribute your suggestions on how the children's play area might be improved**
- **To make suggestions about how Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) money might be used**
- **Consider becoming a Kislingbury Parish Councillor**

These notes touch on all these five issues.

Hodges Lane Planning Proposal

Since the last Kislingbury News, the Parish Council and a number of Parishioners have raised concerns about the proposal to build 3 new houses on land at the end of Hodges Lane (behind the Cromwell Cottage). The Parish Council has submitted its objection to West Northants Council. At the meeting on 16th May 2023, a number of residents were present and expressed concerns including the dangers to pedestrians (especially children being dropped off at school) of vehicle access. One villager has been kind enough to share his concerns including those relating to heritage assets in a conservation area, a failure in the proposal to provide information about how biodiversity will be protected, the problems caused by vehicles delivering to the Cromwell Cottage, the issues that would be caused for fire and rescue service access and flooding.

The concerns about flooding are echoed by Chris Payne, our flood warden who agrees with the villager that the proposed site is in a high risk area and that the National Policy Planning Framework makes it clear that development should be avoided.

As a result of these concerns, Ann Addison in her role as Kislingbury Lead member on WNC will ask for this application to be 'called in' so that it can be reviewed by elected members. We understand from another member that Councillor Adam Brown has also been asked to call in this application.

Proposed development on Camp Lane and Beech Lane

In relation to the proposal to build 58 new houses between Camp and Lane and Beech Lane, we understand that the developer has been asked to submit new proposals principally in relation to access. As this counts as a new proposal the 90 comments that were made on the original proposal are not applicable and any comments and objections have to be made anew. The Parish Council will alert villagers when the new objections can be made.

Please be ready to make your objections when the 'new' proposal is put out for comment. Again these would need to be made via the WNC Planning Portal.

Village Tree Survey

Zoe Kemp (the tree warden), in her annual report, outlined that she has been conducting a survey of trees in the village and is putting these on a Woodlands Trust App. She is encouraging anyone with trees in their gardens to do the same. Ultimately this 'log' of village trees will be on the new Parish Council website which will be going 'live' shortly.

Why not add your garden trees to the survey so we know how many trees the village boasts.

Children's Play Area

The Parish Council has been aware for some time of the concern about the lack of progress in improving the children's play area since the fundraising efforts of some three years ago. As a result of these concerns, we met with representatives of KPFA on 18th April 2023 to make proposals about the use of money already raised. These proposals included the suggestion of the development of a timeline agreed by the Parish Council and KPFA for the maintenance and improvement of the play area. The Parish Council also suggested that parents of children of an age to enjoy the playground should be asked for their views. The Parish Council is still waiting for a response to these proposals.

The Parish Council wants to hear what you think about what the priorities for improving might be. We are particularly keen to hear from parents and carers of children up to the age or about 11 or 12 what they feel their children would like most.

Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) Money

As a result of the Spitfire development the village will be entitled to a significant amount of Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) money. This money has to be spent in ways that can benefit all villagers.

Please have a think about how CIL money could be used for the benefit of the village.

Kislingbury needs 3 new Parish Councillors

Since the last Parish Council Notes appeared, Miriam Harris has resigned as a Parish Councillor. Her resignation marks the end of 17 years as a Parish Councillor. Her service is widely recognised and will be marked by the Parish Council with a card and flowers.

Miriam's resignation means that the Parish Council now has three vacancies. We would, of course, welcome expressions of interest from anyone who has the interest of the village at heart. However, we would particularly welcome people with some expertise in social media.

Please consider becoming a Kislingbury Parish Councillor. If you think you might be interested please contact the Parish Clerk. Alternatively you might like to come to one of the Parish Council's monthly meetings to see what we are about.

Some other issues

Flooding and water drainage are very important issues for a village so close to the River Nene. The Parish Council is concerned that a number of local ditches appear to be blocked, for example along Camp Lane. The Parish Clerk will be contacting all local farmers to ask them to clear the ditches for which they are responsible. The Parish Council is still trying to agree a site visit to the Pembleton development on the Rothersthorpe Road to address issues about the balancing pool on the development.

Community Pantry

The Community Pantry scheme is open to all Kislingbury residents who are in need and provides a weekly grocery box. All requests for help will be treated confidentially and comply with data protection regulations. If you wish to apply, please contact the Parish Clerk. I would like to thank those who work hard on behalf of the pantry. If you would like to make a donation 'in kind' these can be left with Miriam Harris (3, The Green). If

you would like to make a monetary donation to the Community Pantry, this should be via the Parish Clerk.

Footpaths

The footpath warden, Phil Beeston has submitted a written report in which he identified problems on the Nene Way between Bugbrooke and Kislingbury caused by crops encroaching on the path. A local farmer who was present on 16th May 2023 said he had trampled some of the crop to make the path wider. Phil also identified that some of the gates are in a poor condition. If you have any concerns about local footpaths please do get in touch with our footpath warden.

Coronation Bookmarks

For the Coronation in May 2023, the Parish Council agreed with the Headteacher that each student at the primary school should receive a commemorative bookmark. I have it on good authority that the children really like the bookmarks, especially the 'cut out' crown.

HGV Vehicles

The Parish Council plans to write to WNC highways asking if vehicle use can be restricted to those under 7.5 tonnes and those that have a destination that requires them to use the High Street, such as those going to and from Bugbrooke Mill.

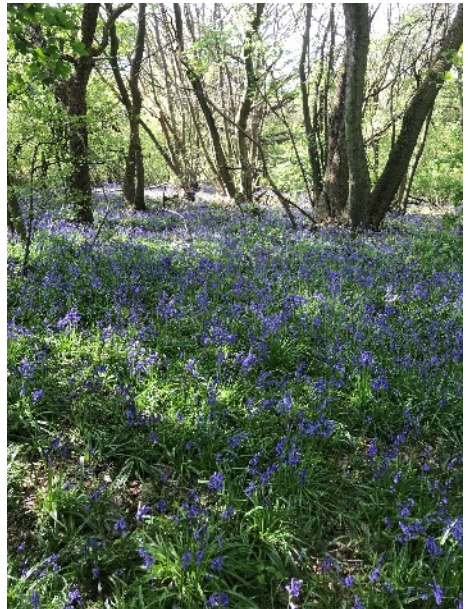

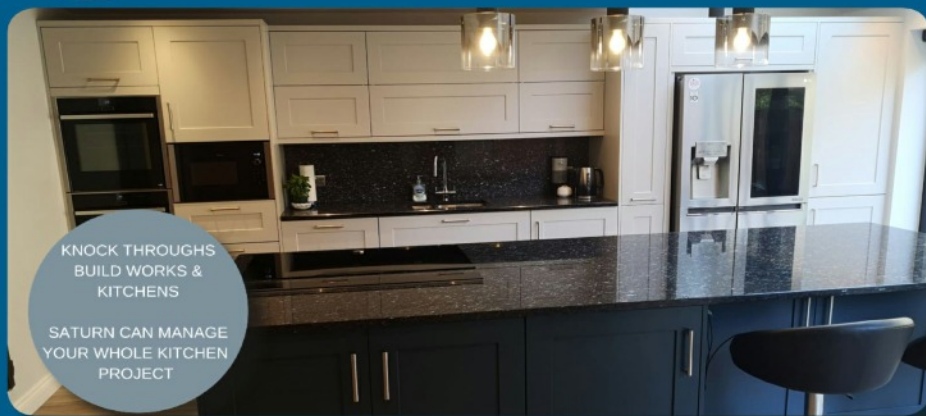
